Workforce, Training and Education

South Carolina is committed to growing and developing its world-class agribusiness industry and workforce. Clemson University's College of Agriculture, Forestry and Life Sciences offers many degree programs, both undergraduate and graduate, related to the agribusiness industry like agricultural education, agricultural business, forest resources management and food packaging science.

Additionally, South Carolina is home to 16 technical colleges, five of which offer degree programs in topics related to agribusiness.

New and Expanding Agribusiness Companies

Since 2011, companies in the agribusiness industry have announced over 7,000 jobs and have invested over \$3 billion in South Carolina.

In 2019 alone, over 700 jobs were announced along with \$417 million in investments.
